The GPO is to cut its cost by £4million because the new 4d and 5d rates are not bringing the expected profit. Instead a 4% drop in the numbermof letters and parcels has occured. Overtime will be reduced. A new service has been announced. Busy executives will soon be able to phone by slipping a coded card into telephones.

The queen is to review the Royal Navy's Western Fleet at Torbay during the summer. New colours will be presented. It will be the queen's first visit to the fleet since 1965 and is the first review that will include a Polaris submatine.

Swindon could become a new centre of the major industry in the next 12 years if recommendations by a study group are accepted. The group have studied possibilities of moving 75,000 people out of London into the area around Swindon.

A number of men who last their job when the firm British Eagle Airways collapsed have formed their own company and called it PHOENIX (Feenix?) Airways. It will be based at Liverpool and concentrate on short haul air freight. Operations will begin in April.




GRILLAGE VILLAGE WHITTERINGS









